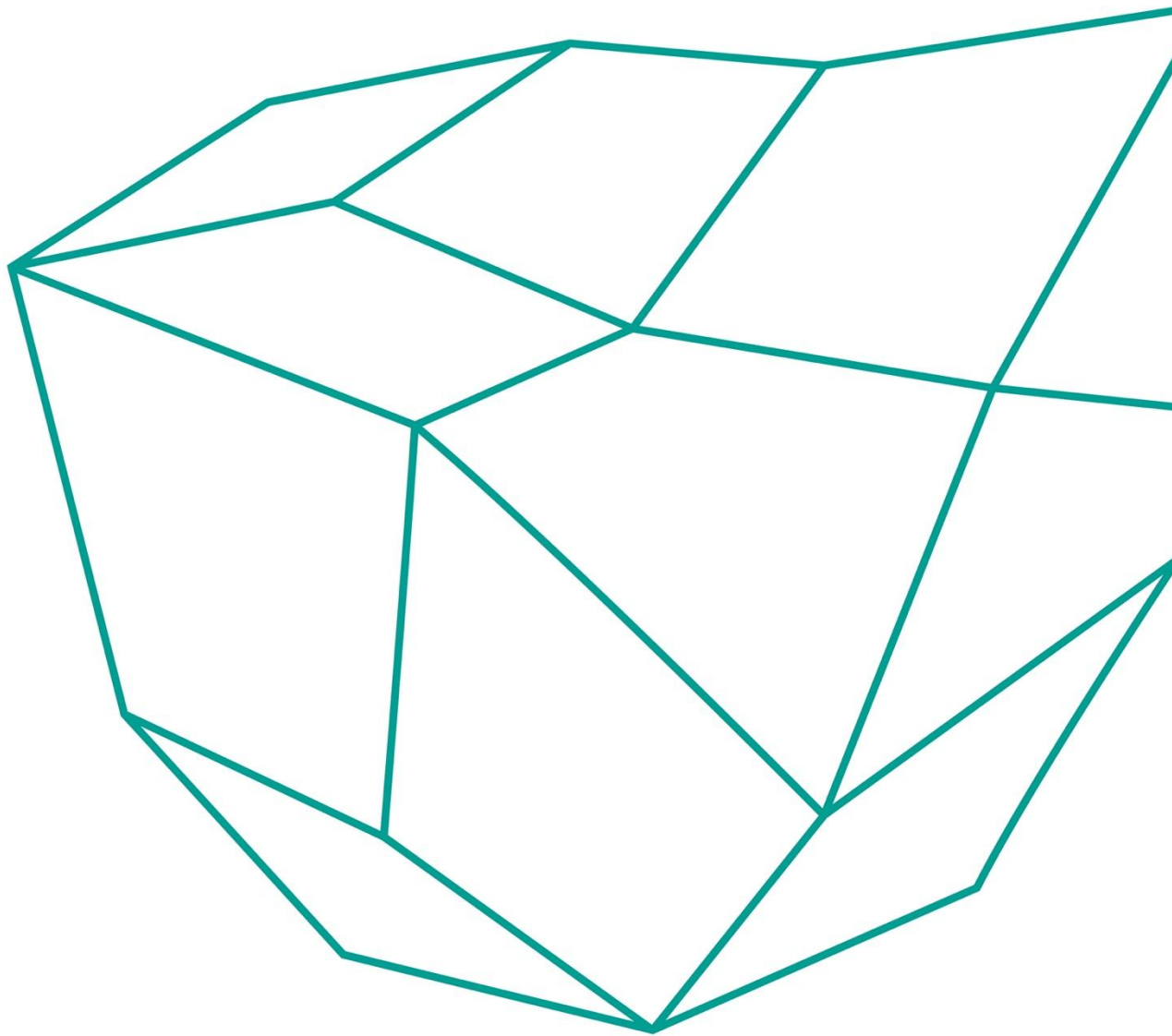

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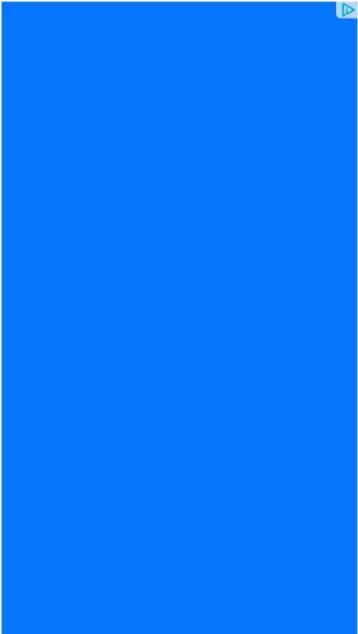

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IBSA Foundation celebra en Barcelona una edición récord de sus becas de investigación

IBSA Foundation para la investigación científica ha celebrado en la Real Academia de Medicina de Cataluña la edición 2025 de sus becas, que han alcanzado una cifra récord de **398 candidaturas procedentes de 64 países**. El acto sirvió también para abrir oficialmente la convocatoria de 2026, en la que el programa aumentará de seis a siete ayudas.



La investigadora española Patricia Rada, del Ciber y del Instituto de Investigaciones Biomédicas Sols Morreale, fue galardonada en la categoría de Endocrinología por un proyecto sobre la proteína PKD2 y su relación con la esteatosis pancreática y la diabetes tipo 2. Con este reconocimiento, España refuerza su posición como **segundo país con más premiados en la historia del programa**.

Durante la jornada, expertos del ámbito científico y empresarial destacaron la importancia de apoyar el talento joven, la investigación de excelencia y el liderazgo femenino en STEM. Las becas, dotadas con **32.000 euros cada una**, buscan impulsar proyectos de investigadores menores de 40 años en áreas como dermatología, fertilidad, dolor, envejecimiento saludable y medicina regenerativa.

La IBSA Foundation para la investigación científica celebra un año récord en su programa de becas con la participación de 398 solicitudes de 64 países. Destaca el proyecto galardonado en endocrinología en España.

IBSA Foundation para la investigación científica – la organización sin ánimo de lucro de la compañía farmacéutica suiza IBSA – ha celebrado en Barcelona un año récord para su prestigioso programa de becas, para el que han recibido 398 solicitudes procedentes de 64 países. En el evento '*IBSA Foundation Fellowship: Impulsando el talento joven, inspirando la ciencia del mañana*', la Fundación ha galardonado a los ganadores de 2025 y ha abierto oficialmente la convocatoria para la edición de 2026.

El acto tuvo lugar en la emblemática Real Academia de Medicina de Cataluña y contó con la presencia de destacadas figuras del ámbito científico y empresarial. Felipe Hortelano, director general de la filial española de IBSA fue el encargado de inaugurar el evento y dio paso a Luis Calvo, delegado Institucional del CSIC en Cataluña, quien abordó la situación de la investigación y de los jóvenes científicos en la región.

España, un referente en talento científico

La edición de 2025 ha puesto de manifiesto la excelencia de la ciencia española. La investigadora Patricia Rada, del Consorcio [Centro de Investigación Biomédica en Red \(CIBER\)](#) y del [Instituto de Investigaciones Biomédicas Sols Morreale \(CSIC–UAM\)](#) en Madrid, ha sido galardonada en el área de endocrinología por su proyecto para descifrar el papel de la proteína quinasa D2 (PKD2) en la esteatosis pancreática, con implicaciones para la diabetes tipo 2.

La fuerte presencia de España en el programa es una tendencia constante. En los últimos años, los candidatos españoles han representado entre un 9% y un 20% del total de solicitudes. Este compromiso se traduce en éxito: los investigadores españoles constituyen casi el 12,5% del total de premiados en la historia del programa, lo que convierte a España en el segundo país con más galardonados.

Impulsando el talento joven, inspirando la ciencia del mañana

Durante la jornada se ha llevado a cabo una mesa redonda, moderada por la periodista Belén Diego, donde un panel de expertos debatió sobre cómo potenciar la investigación de excelencia. En ella, Alessandro Ruggiero, secretario general de IBSA Group, explicó el compromiso de la compañía: "Como compañía farmacéutica, estamos enfocados en la innovación, pero sabemos que los verdaderos avances requieren tiempo y constancia. Creemos que empoderar a mentes jóvenes y brillantes para que persigan la investigación fundamental es la única manera de construir la cartera de descubrimientos que conducirán a las aplicaciones y terapias del mañana".

En esa misma línea, Silvia Misiti, directora de IBSA Foundation para la investigación científica, profundizó en el propósito del programa y su impacto: "Las *IBSA Foundation Fellowships* son el corazón de nuestra misión. Desde nuestro inicio en 2013, hemos invertido más de 1.8 millones de euros para apoyar 65 proyectos de investigadores menores de 40 años en áreas críticas como dermatología, fertilidad y envejecimiento saludable. Estoy especialmente orgullosa de que España haya sido un contribuyente destacado, con un número alto de solicitantes y ganadores, lo que refleja el increíble talento de este país. Estas becas son una inversión no solo en carreras individuales, sino en el futuro colectivo del conocimiento."

Desde el ámbito de la investigación pública, Lluís Montoliu, Científico del **CSIC**, reforzó la importancia de estas ayudas. "El panorama de la investigación en España presenta grandes talentos y desafíos significativos. Iniciativas como las IBSA Foundation Fellowships son de vital importancia, ya que ofrecen a los jóvenes investigadores los recursos y la autonomía necesarios para desarrollar ideas innovadoras que difícilmente encontrarían financiación por otras vías. Nos permiten abordar la fuga de cerebros y consolidar un ecosistema donde el talento joven pueda no solo iniciar, sino también consolidar carreras científicas sólidas en nuestro país."

La aplicación práctica de estos avances fue subrayada por Elena Labarta, Ginecóloga especialista en Medicina Reproductiva, quien añadió que, "como especialista que opera en la intersección de la práctica clínica diaria y la investigación de vanguardia, puedo afirmar que el apoyo a la investigación se traduce directamente en avances clínicos, permitiendo desarrollar tratamientos más personalizados y efectivos para las personas. Es crucial cerrar la brecha entre el descubrimiento académico y la aplicación práctica en la medicina, y en este proceso, el mentorazgo desempeña un papel fundamental, guiando a la próxima generación de médicos-científicos."

El debate también abordó la creciente presencia femenina en la ciencia. Mar Porras, presidenta de la **STEM Woman Association** afirmó durante su intervención que "es inspirador ver que casi el 60% de las solicitudes para estas becas provienen de mujeres, un testimonio claro del talento femenino en STEM. Este tipo de programas desempeñan un papel clave en la promoción y consolidación del liderazgo femenino en estas disciplinas. Sin embargo, nuestro objetivo debe ir más allá del apoyo individual; debemos construir culturas sistémicas e inclusivas dentro de las instituciones científicas que activamente promuevan el mentorazgo y la visibilidad de modelos a seguir, garantizando que las mujeres no solo accedan, sino que también se desarrollen y asuman roles de liderazgo en el ámbito científico."

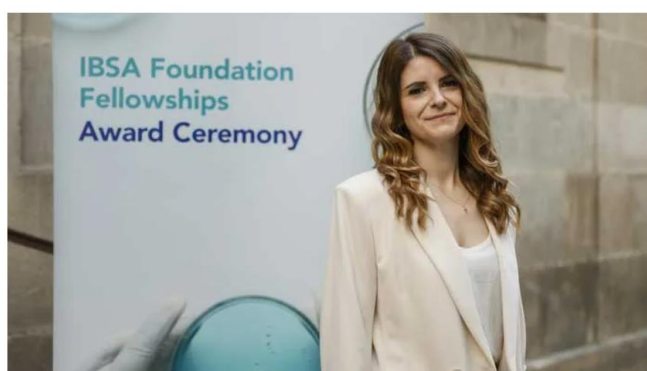

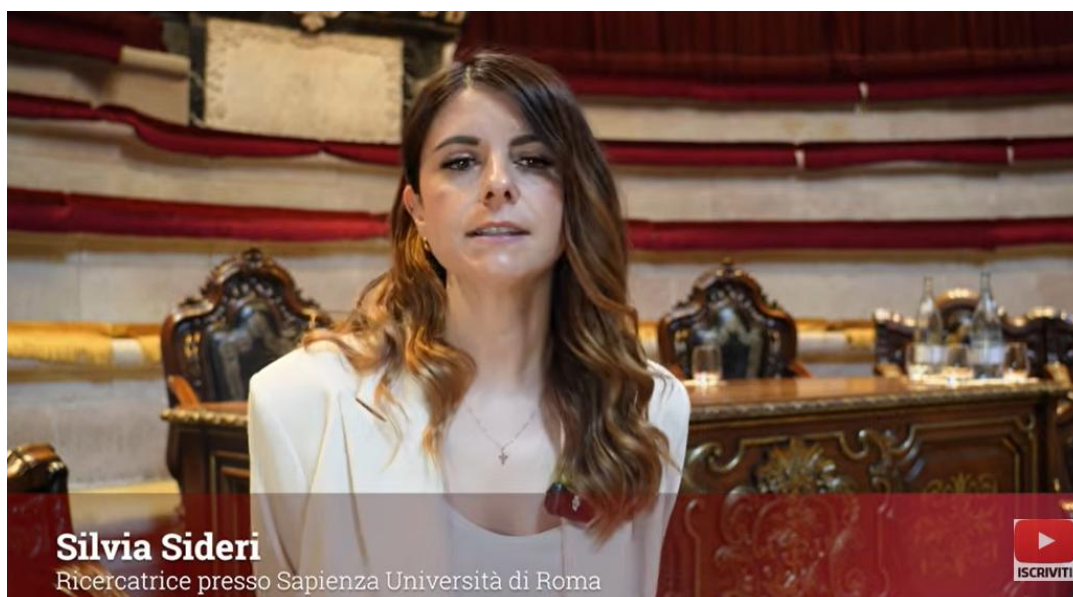

US Researcher Indranil Singh is Among the Winners of the 13th Edition of the IBSA Foundation Fellowship for His Innovative Research on Aging

The IBSA Foundation for scientific research announced that a young US researcher is among the winners of the 13th edition of the IBSA Foundation Fellowship, the prestigious program promoted by IBSA Foundation to support scientific research. Every year six fellowships of €32,000 each are awarded to young scientists under the age of 40.

Indranil Singh of the *Department of Stem Cell and Regenerative Biology at Harvard University* and the *Biology of Adversity Project at the Broad Institute of MIT and Harvard* is an awardee in the "healthy aging/regenerative medicine" category. Singh's project, "*Psychosocial stress induced viral mimicry as an epigenetic writer of immune aging*," will examine how chronic psychosocial stress triggers antiviral-like immune programs in hematopoietic stem

cells and leaves lasting epigenetic changes that resemble immune aging. Singh's research aims to map these stress-driven trajectories and test whether blocking key "writer" pathways can reverse persistent inflammation and preserve immune regeneration to support a healthy lifespan.

The Fellowship Program and 2025 Edition

The IBSA Foundation Fellowship program supports young scientists under 40 by funding innovative basic research in key scientific areas: dermatology, endocrinology, fertility/urology, orthopedics/rheumatology/pain medicine, and healthy aging/regenerative medicine. In an increasingly competitive funding landscape for early-career researchers, the program continues to play an important role in fostering the next generation of scientific talent.

This year, IBSA Foundation for scientific research received a record 398 applications from researchers in 64 countries. This milestone was celebrated in Barcelona (Spain) during the event "*Empowering Young Talent, Inspiring Tomorrow's Science*", which honored the 2025 Fellowship recipients and officially launched the 2026 call for applications.

Global Reach and Emerging Scientific Priorities

Opening of the 2026 Call for Applications

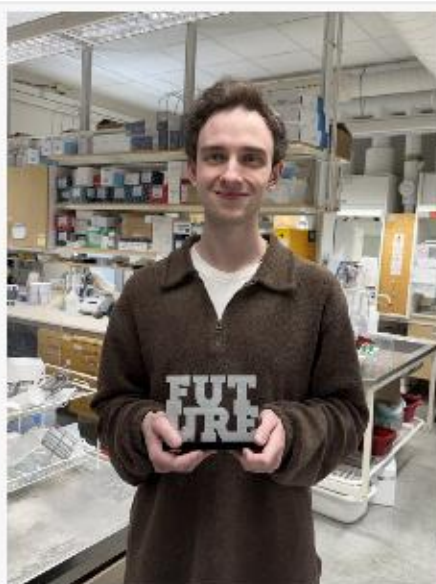

With treatment for this cancer limited and treatment resistance common, Matthew is exploring new avenues of treatment strategies to improve patient outcomes, including targeting mitochondria and its quality control mechanism, mitochondrial dynamics.

A huge well done to Matthew!



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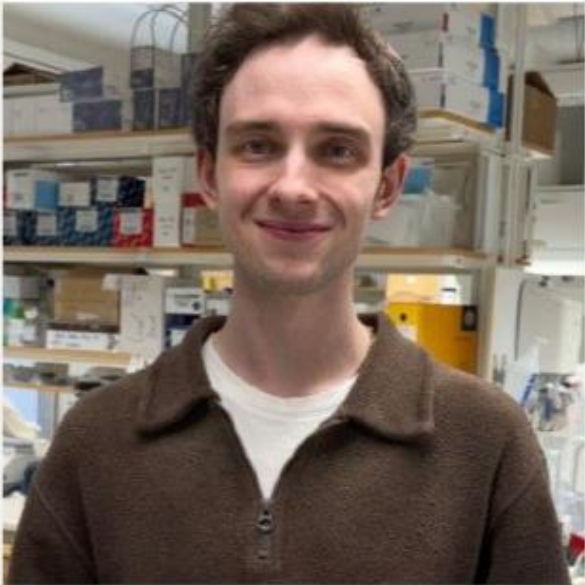
